




PSRAI OMNIBUS SURVEY RESULTS

Autism Awareness Month

In observance of Autism Awareness Month, PSRAI asked Americans about their knowledge and views of the disorder. Two-thirds say they know at least a little about autism spectrum disorder. Fifteen percent say they know a lot, 24% say they know some, and 26% say they know a little.

One-third of Americans say they know nothing about autism. The largest shares of those who report not having knowledge about autism are racial and ethnic minorities (46%), including over half of Hispanics (55%); adults with a high school education or less (44%); and seniors age 65 or older (38%).

Majorities of those who say they know at least a little about autism say progress has been made in diagnosing, treating, and assisting people with autism in the United States.



Methodology

The survey was conducted by Princeton Survey Research Associates International (PSRAI). Interviewing by landline or cellular telephones occurred from March 16-19, 2017 among a random sample of 1,001 U.S. adults. Interviews were conducted in English or Spanish. Data have been weighted to parameters from the U.S. Census Bureau. The margin of error for results based on the complete set of weighted data is +/- 3.8 percentage points.
